The Bowel Nosodes Reappraised



Many patients with chronic illness are difficult to treat due to biological obstacles to cure. Intestinal dysbiosis is increasingly recognised as both a complication and corollary cause of chronic illness.

This seminar provides information that will help clinicians to recognise and understand this important factor in chronic disease. Participants will also learn how to use Intestinal Nosodes within a wider treatment strategy for chronic cases, providing a vital pathway towards illness resolution.

The history, source and composition of the nosodes is discussed in the light of modern micro-ecology. Illustrative cases are provided to help participants grasp the main indications for all the main intestinal nosodes and treatment guidelines are provided on the timing and sequencing of nosodes in relation to classical homeopathic treatments.
